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Course overview:

In this course students will be presented with the daily English language that they need in the subjects they study throughout the academic year. Students are given the knowledge of the terms and abbreviations related to the subjects and the field of information and computer technology, so that they can overcome linguistic problems when they use it. Listening and speaking skills will be studied through multidimensional sources (reading, writing, speaking and listening) with the use of links, videos and other visual aids. Grammar, vocabulary and expressions will be included but the method of teaching will remains as communicative as possible.

- Students will be able to present seminars, presentations, and do research and reading related to their specialty.
